Form PR/CK47A Personal Registration / Certificate of Knowledge - Drugs, Profiteering & Moneylaundering Act 2003

About this form

Money transfers abroad are controlled by law, to make sure they do not distribute profits made from selling drugs, and to prevent the funding of terrorism. Under the Drugs, Profiteering & Moneylaundering Act 2003, official permission is needed for transfers of over £10 to foreign nationals.

If you seek permission to receive such a transfer, you must fill in this form and return it to the person whom you expect to be sending you money. He will then file it with his local Customs and Excise office for permission, which will normally be granted or refused within 48 hours. Bear in mind that transferring more than £10 to a foreign national, by 'money courier' or direct bank to bank ('wire') transfer, and without official permission, is a crime under the Act and can be punished by up to 5 years in prison.

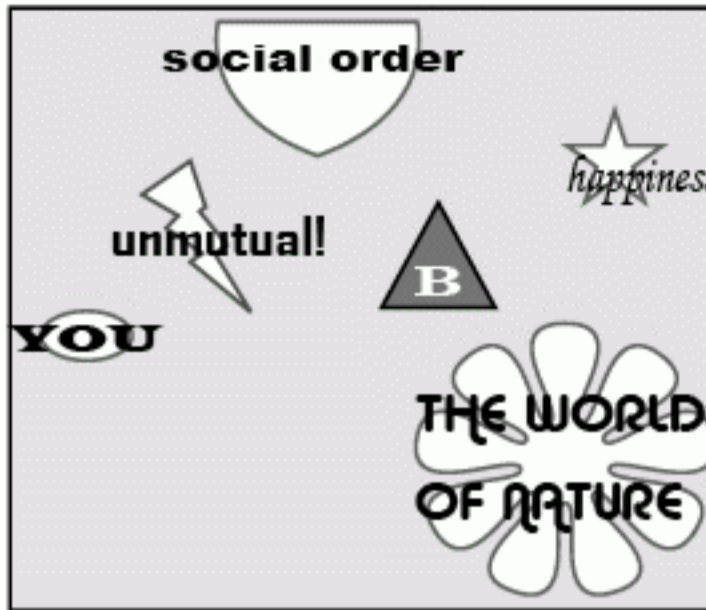
